
#### Year 4 Visit to St Nicholas High School

#### About Us

The Royal British Legion is the best known Armed Forces charity in the UK. On a national basis we provide lifelong support to the Armed Forces Community, Our support starts after one day of service and continues through life, long after service is over.

The Alsager Branch has undergone some changes. We want to help the Armed Forces Community in our local area. It could be a referral to a food bank, obtaining household items or just being there to listen. We want Alsager and surrounding areas to know that we are here to help. We hold monthly Coffee Mornings where all food and drink is free so that no-one has to miss out on social interaction due to finances. We provide a safe and friendly space to have a chat, meet new people and be a touchpoint for those that require our services.









#### What is BOD?



- BOD is a brand new, free service that we are offering to the Armed Forces Community in Alsager and surrounding areas.
- We provide a free Portal device which allows the user to be able to participate in meetings and events from the comfort of their own home.
- Video calls can also be made to friends and family.
- No internet? No problem! We can provide it for you.
- Over the coming months, online workshops will be added as well as being able to book GP appointments and much more.

### Why?

Many people are unaware of the support that the RBL can provide. We want those who serve, and have served, to feel a part of the community, to know that they matter. As many as 154 people who live in care homes within Cheshire East, have previously served in the Armed Forces. We want to reach out to these veterans as well as others. Two of the challenges faced by older members of the Armed Forces Community are isolation and technology. The aim of BOD is to overcome these problems. Isolation can led to mental health issues so with our project aiding social inclusion and connection, we are hoping to ease this.
