Mrs Burt very kindly came in to talk about this important Islamic festival. Ramadan began on the evening of Wednesday, 22nd March , 2023 and ends on Thursday, 20th April 2023. During the month of Ramadan, Muslims won't eat or drink between dawn and sunset. This is called fasting. Fasting is also important to Christians. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. 
