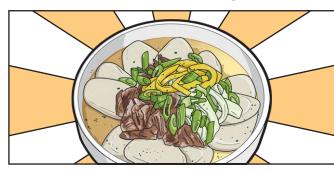

Joseph Trevor Wicks was born on 21st September 1985 and grew up in Epsom, Surrey. In school, Joe loved PE and decided he wanted to become a PE teacher when he grew up. In 2002, he studied nutrition and fitness at NESCOT College of Technology.

Joe went to St Mary's University in Twickenham and graduated in 2005. After graduation, Joe got a job as a teaching assistant but soon decided to become a personal trainer instead.

Using social media, Joe began posting short 15-second healthy recipe videos on Instagram and started his own YouTube channel called 'The Body Coach TV' in 2014. He posted daily workout videos for his **followers**.









In March 2020, the UK went into the first of several lockdowns because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Every day, Joe streamed live workouts on his YouTube channel to help people keep exercising. Joe's second session of 'PE With Joe' was watched by almost one million people. Over time, he raised and donated over £500,000 to the NHS.

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Did You Know...? Joe married Rosie Jones in 2019. They live in Richmond, London with their three children.

Additional Contributions

In June 2020, Queen Elizabeth II awarded Joe an **MBE** for services to fitness and charity. He also raised £2m for Children in Need in November 2020. In addition, Joe created workout videos with the CBeebies character Duggee in September 2021. In July 2022, Joe was given a special university degree from St Mary's University in Twickenham. He continues to write books, record podcasts, appear on TV and regularly posts on social media in order to help people stay healthy.

In 2005, Joe graduated from St Mary's University in Twickenham with a degree in Sports Science. Not long after, Joe worked as a teaching assistant at a school in Kingston but felt it wasn't for him. He decided to try a different career by working as a **personal trainer** instead.

After struggling to find customers, Joe tried social media as a way of getting people interested in improving their fitness and nutrition. In 2014, he began posting short 15-second recipe videos on Instagram and started his own YouTube channel called 'The Body Coach TV'.

In November 2020, Joe completed a 24-hour fitness workout that raised £2m for Children in Need.









In March 2020, the whole country went into the first of several lockdowns because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Trying to encourage people to still exercise, Joe began streaming daily half-hour workouts broadcast live on his YouTube channel. Joe's second session of 'PE With Joe' was watched by almost one million people and set a Guinness World Record for the highest number of people watching a workout session live on YouTube.

While running these online classes, he raised and donated over £500,000 to the NHS.

In September 2021, Joe filmed videos with the CBeebies character Duggee that aimed to inspire children to earn their 'Workout Badges'. In July 2022, St Mary's University in Twickenham gave Joe a special university degree.



Joe married Rosie Jones in June 2019. They have three children and live in Richmond, London. Always trying to help people eat healthily and exercise, Joe continues to write books, record podcasts, appear on TV and regularly posts on social media.

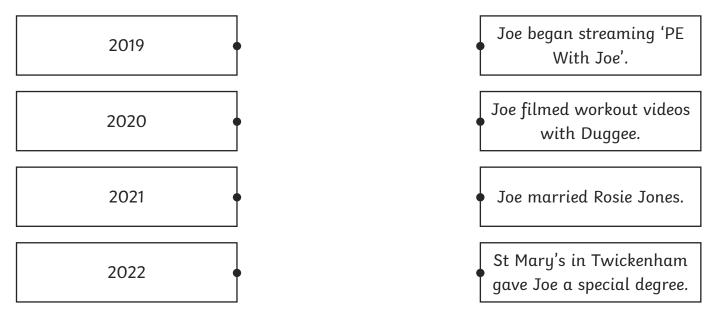

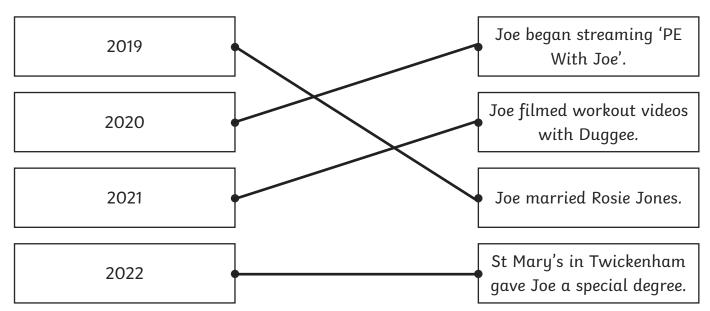

Studying for a degree in Sports Science, Joe graduated from St Mary's University in Twickenham in 2005. After finishing university, Joe was hired as a teaching assistant at a primary school in Kingston. Unfortunately, Joe realised it wasn't for him so he decided to become a personal trainer instead.

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○ ○ ○ Although Joe handed out many flyers for his boot camp-style classes, he struggled to find many people who were interested in coming. Using social media, Joe tried a different way of getting people interested in fitness and nutrition. In 2014, he began posting short 15-second recipe videos on Instagram and started his own YouTube channel called 'The Body Coach TV'. Every day, he led his viewers through many high-intensity interval training workouts.







PE With Joe

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the whole country went into the first of several lockdowns in March 2020. Using his social media accounts to encourage people to exercise at home, Joe began streaming daily half-hour workout sessions broadcast live on his YouTube channel. Joe's second session of 'PE With Joe' was watched by almost one million people and set a **Guinness World Record** for the highest number of people watching a workout session live on YouTube. Using'PE with Joe', he raised and donated over £500,000 to the NHS.



Additional Contributions

For services to fitness and charity, Queen Elizabeth II awarded Joe an MBE (Member of the British Empire) in June 2020.

By November 2020, Joe was a well-known public figure and was able to raise £2m for Children in Need by completing a 24-hour fitness workout. In September 2021, Joe worked with the CBeebies character Duggee from 'Hey Duggee' to film a series of exercise videos that inspired children to earn their 'Workout Badges'. In July 2022, St Mary's University in Twickenham awarded Joe with a special university degree, which was an Honorary Doctorate in Sport and Exercise Science.



In June 2019, Joe married Rosie Jones. They have three children together and currently reside in Richmond, London. 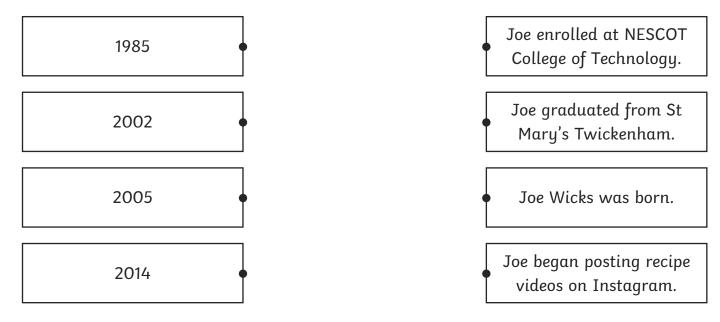

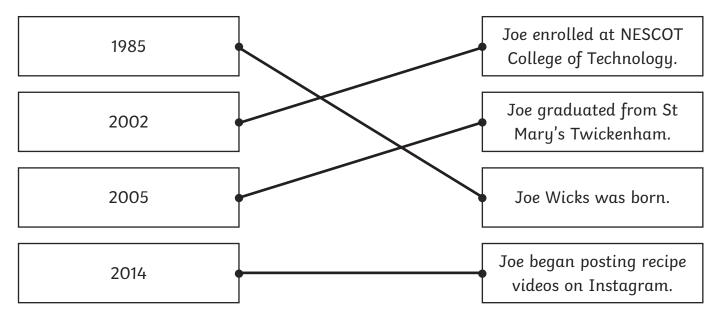
