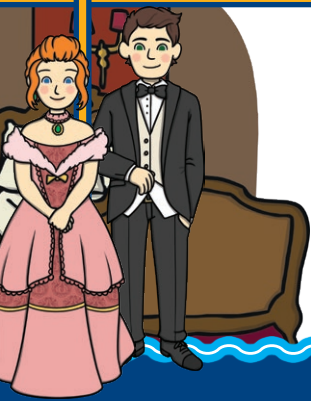


The Titanic

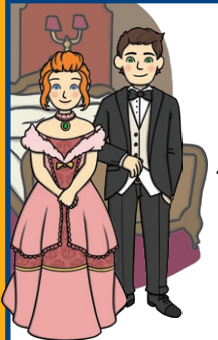

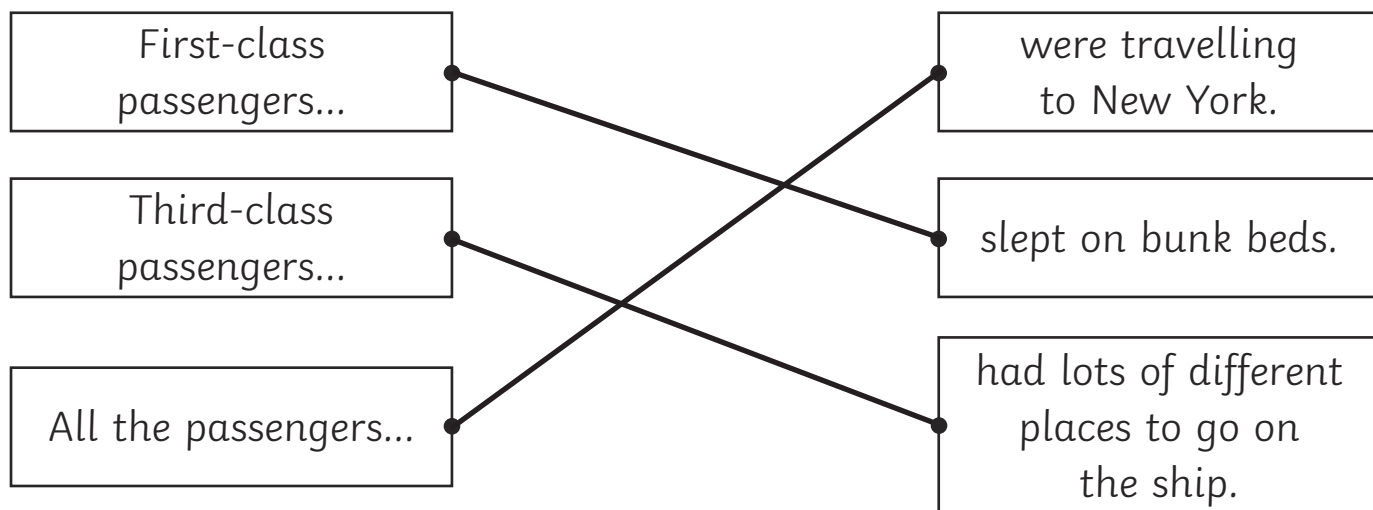

What Could You Do on the Titanic?



There were lots of things to do on the Titanic! If you bought the most expensive ticket, you travelled in first class. First-class passengers had a private bathroom, sitting room and bedroom. You could go to restaurants, enjoy music and dancing or swim in the pool.

If you bought the cheapest tickets, you travelled in third class. Third-class passengers slept on bunk beds in crowded cabins. There were only two bathrooms for all the third-class passengers on board! There were fewer places to go on board the ship.

Why Didn't the Titanic Reach America?

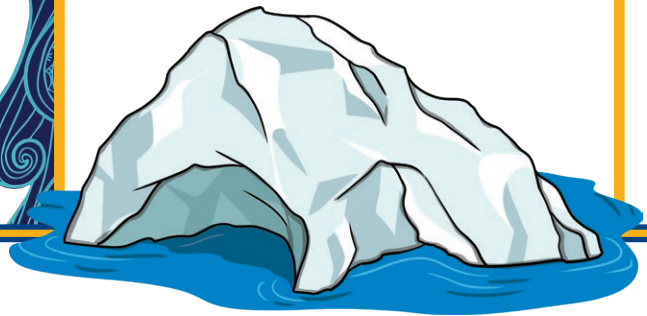
The Titanic hit an iceberg. It sank on 15th April 1912 and many people died.

There are lots of different ideas about why the Titanic sank. Some people say the ship's captain ignored warnings about icebergs and that the disaster might never have happened if he had slowed down. Other people say the screws holding the ship together were made from poor-quality iron so the ship broke easily when the iceberg hit.
