She placed the frog into a well.

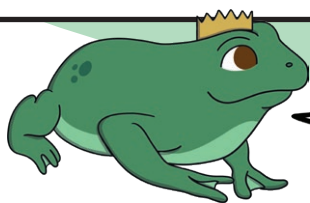


A princess was playing near the well with her golden ball. The golden ball was a birthday gift from the king.

The princess pleaded with the frog to dive into the well and return her ball. The frog said,

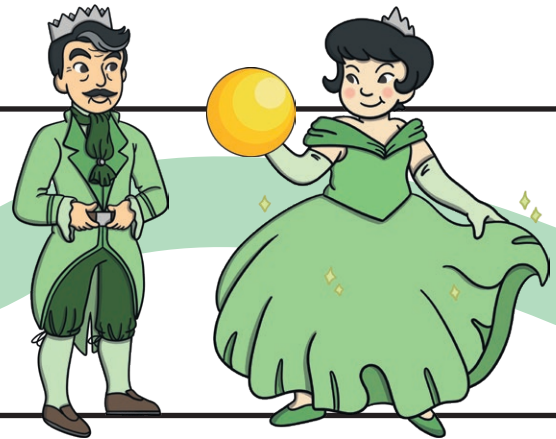


I will return your ball if you will be my friend, let me eat from your plate and sleep at the palace.

Later, the princess told her father what had happened. The king was very disappointed and warned her to keep the promises she had made.

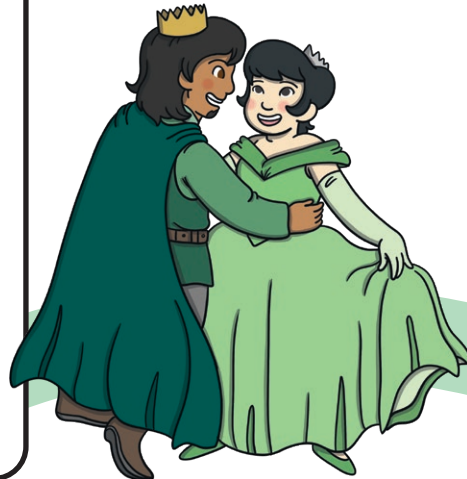
