Thank you to Mrs Ashley, Mrs Bourne and Miss Cook for laying the groundwork for us to be able to welcome Nursery-age children into St Mary's so that we are best placed to serve our Reception and Nursery pupils. From September, our Nursery class will be based in the spare classroom.

School Uniform

From January, pupils are to come to school in their uniform every day. PE kits are to be brought into school at the start of term and pupils will change for their PE lessons. This will help the children with their life skills. It is another step towards normality after the COVID-19 pandemic. Below is a reminder of the school uniform:

*Grey trousers/shorts

*Grey skirts or tunics.

*White shirts worn with school tie.

*Green sweatshirts/cardigans, with school logo.

*Grey socks - preferred

*School Baseball cap (optional)

Summer uniform options:

*green & white classic gingham dress

*Showerproof jacket/Storm jacket in green with St Mary's logo

Sensible black school shoes are required. Trainers are not allowed other than for outdoor PE.

PE Uniform:

*Black shorts - tight, hot pant type shorts are not advised

*Green Polo shirt with school logo

*Black slip-on plimsolls.

*Black Trainers (for outdoor PE only)

*Black jogging bottoms, with school logo

Each child needs a named PE bag to be kept in school.

School Dinners

Just a little bit of context regarding school dinners:

Cheshire East Catering Services notified the school that they were withdrawing their services by April 2025 and from September 2024 increased the school meal cost to £3.20 which was passed onto parents.

The school served notice to Cheshire East Catering Services and underwent a vigorous catering procurement process with RPJ3 Group, who are a Facilities, Food Service and Audit Group. An audit was carried out audit at the end of September which led to the conclusion that Aspens Catering Service were the best option in terms of presentation, reputation, financials, food offering and promotion.

Having given it a lot of consideration we decided to proceed and appoint Aspens from January 2025 to deliver the school catering services. The price of the meals offered to parents is £3.20, we had hoped it would be lower but this is the minimum cost the school can charge in line with the providers selling price and the school budget.

Attendance



As we start a new academic year in supporting your child's education, we want to inform you of important changes to the law regarding school attendance as attached letter. These changes, are effective from 19th August 2024, are part of a new National Framework for Penalty Notices, including those for unauthorised holiday absences.

We understand that these new regulations might bring up some questions or concerns, and we want to assure you that we are here to support you through this transition.

Dear Parents / Carers,

IMPORTANT NOTICE: CHANGES TO ATTENDANCE LAWS

We hope this message finds you and your family well and that you have had a restful summer. As we start a new academic year in supporting your child's education, we want to inform you of important changes to the law regarding school attendance. These changes, are effective From 19th August 2024, are part of a new National Framework for Penalty Notices, including those for unauthorised holiday absences.

We understand that these new regulations might bring up some questions or concerns, and we want to assure you that we are here to support you through this transition.

What Are the Changes?

National Threshold for Unauthorised Absences: Beginning 19th August 2024, a penalty notice will be considered if your child accumulates 10 unauthorised sessions (equivalent to 5 school days) within a rolling 10-week school period, for any reason.

 Holiday Absences: We understand the importance of family time, but under the new rules, taking your child out of school for a week's holiday during term time will now result in a penalty notice being issued.

- Increased Penalty Fines: The fine for unauthorised absences will increase from £60 to £80 if paid within 21 days. If not paid within this period, the fine will rise to £160 if paid within 28 days.
- 4. Repeat Offenses: If a second penalty notice is issued for the same child within a rolling 3-year period, the fine will automatically be £160, with no option to pay the lower rate. Should further absences occur, the local authority may consider additional enforcement
- Additional Enforcement Options: In the case of a third offence within a 3-year period, the local authority will consider further steps to address the attendance issues.

We're Here to Support You: We understand that these changes may seem challenging, and that life can sometimes make regular attendance difficult. If you have any concerns about how these new rules might impact your family, we encourage you to reach out to your child's Education Family Support Worker. They are available to discuss your situation and provide support, whether It's offering advice, resources, or helping to find solutions that work for your family.



I'm Kelly Gooch and I work as an Education Family Support Worker in the Attendance and Children out of School Team at Cheshire East Council. Data analysis shows that every minute counts in school, and those with higher attendance achieve higher scores both academically and socially as a result. I'm very pleased to be working with St Mary's Catholic Primary School, and becoming part of your local school community, to increase attendance and to help achieve the best outcomes for your children.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs):

Q: If I have already booked a holiday for next year, could I receive a penalty fine at the new higher rate?

A: Yes, if the absence is not authorised by the Head Teacher. However, if you have concerns or special circumstances, please discuss them with your child's Education Family Support Worker or Headteacher as soon as possible.

Q: Who can be issued with a penalty notice? A: Each parent can receive a fine for each child who has unauthorised absences. This includes anyone who lives with the child and is involved in their day-to-day care, such as step-parents or partners.

Q: Do the new rules only apply to holidays during term time? A: No, they apply to all unauthorised absences, including truancy, arriving late after 9:15 am, and failing to provide reasons for absence.

Q: How do I request leave for my child during term time? A: If you need to request leave, please submit a written request to the Head Teacher at least 20 days before the proposed absence. We understand that there may be exceptional circumstances, and your child's Education Family Support Worker can help you navigate this process.

Q: Do the 10 sessions of unauthorised absence need to be consecutive? A: No, the 10 sessions can occur at any time within a rolling 10-week period, either consecutively or non-consecutively

Q: What should I do if I am worried about my child's attendance? A: If you're concerned about your child's attendance, we encourage you to reach out to your child's Education Family Support Worker. They are dedicated to working with you to improve the situation and ensure your child receives the support they need.

We sincerely appreciate your co-operation and understanding as we work together to ensure the best possible educational experience for your child. Please do not hesitate to reach out to us for any assistance you may need.

Nut Free School



As our schools have pupils who suffer from a serious nut allergy, we therefore request that parents and carers do not send food to school that contains nuts.

Important Information about additional funding for your child's school - PLEASE READ

The Council provides two types of free school meals to children attending a school within the Cheshire East Borough.

Free school meals for infants - Children at school and in reception class, year 1 or year 2 (key stage 1) can have free school meals. This is called universal infant free school meals (UIFSM). You don't need to claim for UIFSM, just contact your child's school.

Income related free school meals IRFSM - If your child is in receipt of income related free school meals, they are automatically eligible for the Household Support Fund³.

You can claim free school meals for each child who attends school in Cheshire East if you receive one of these benefits:

- Universal Credit with no earned income or with net monthly earnings less than £616.67
- Income Support
- Income based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income related Employment Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit as long as you have a yearly household income of less than £16,190 (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs) and do not get Working Tax Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

We suggest you do make a claim for free school meals even if your child is in key stage 1 as the school can claim additional funding (pupil premium) for new equipment and resources.

You can apply for nursery-age children if they attend before and after lunch sessions at a local authority nursery school, nursery class or an Academy nursery if it has the same Ofsted number as the primary school.

If your claim is not successful or requires further information, they will contact you

If you think you may be eligible it is really important that you apply online or by phone to help make sure St Mary's school is as well funded as possible.

ParentPay Accounts

Please can you check your ParentPay accounts for each child are up to date for the week ahead.

The school operates a **NO DEBT** rule relating to the provision of school meals so please ensure your school meal account is in credit for the week ahead.

Please note this message does not apply to school trip items which already have payments schedules in place.

We would like to thank all parents / carers that pay promptly, as this ensures that all money that is for children's learning is available.

After School & Breakfast Club bookings

Please book on ParentPay.

The cut-off date for Breakfast Club bookings is 11am the day before the booking.

The cut-off date for After School Club bookings is 11am on the day.

This is so that staffing and numbers can be set and managed.

Users will be able to cancel and make changes to their booking up until the booking cut off time.

If a child is picked up late from After School Club a charge of £5 will be made for every 15 minutes beyond the collection time.

After the cut off time, if a child is booked into a club and does not attend, the fee will still apply as the charge relates to the place being held not the actual attendance.
