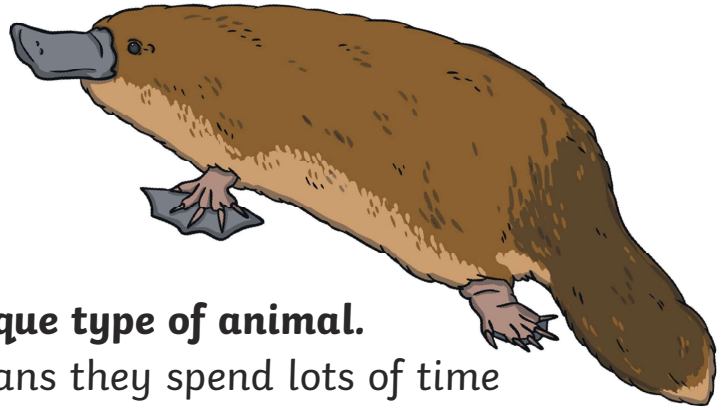


What is a Duck-Billed Platypus?

Species: Mammal

Location: Eastern Australia

Diet: Carnivore

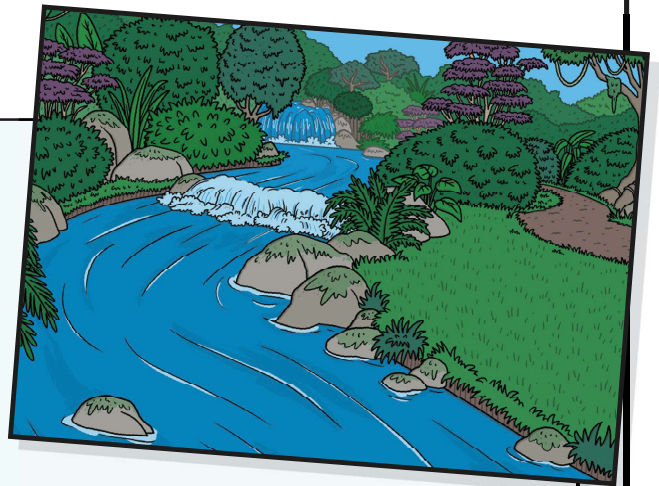


Duck-billed platypuses are a unique type of animal.

They are semi-aquatic, which means they spend lots of time both in the water and on land. They are also one of the only types of mammals that lay eggs.

Habitat

These curious creatures are only found in eastern parts of Australia, including the island of Tasmania. They like to live in and around cool streams and rivers and have been spotted both in the highlands and the tropical rainforests nearer the coasts. The platypus is mostly nocturnal, meaning that they are most active during the night.



Special Skills

As well as looking like a strange mixture of a duck, a beaver and an otter, the platypus has lots of amazing skills.

Swimming

The platypus is a strong swimmer and spends most of its life in the water. It can dive for around 30 to 40 seconds at a time. The wide tail helps it to change direction underwater.

Electrolocation

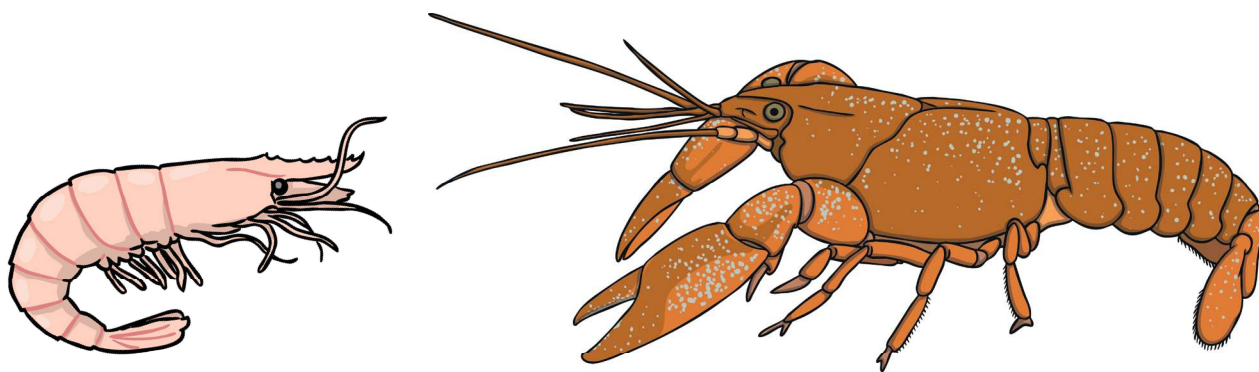
The platypus has special sensors on its bill which detect movements in the water. It closes its eyes, ears and nose when it swims and uses the sensors to locate its prey.

Venom

Both the male and female platypus have spurs (a type of bone) on their ankles. In the male, these spurs contain venom. This venom is strong enough to hurt a human and even kill small animals.

Diet and Predators

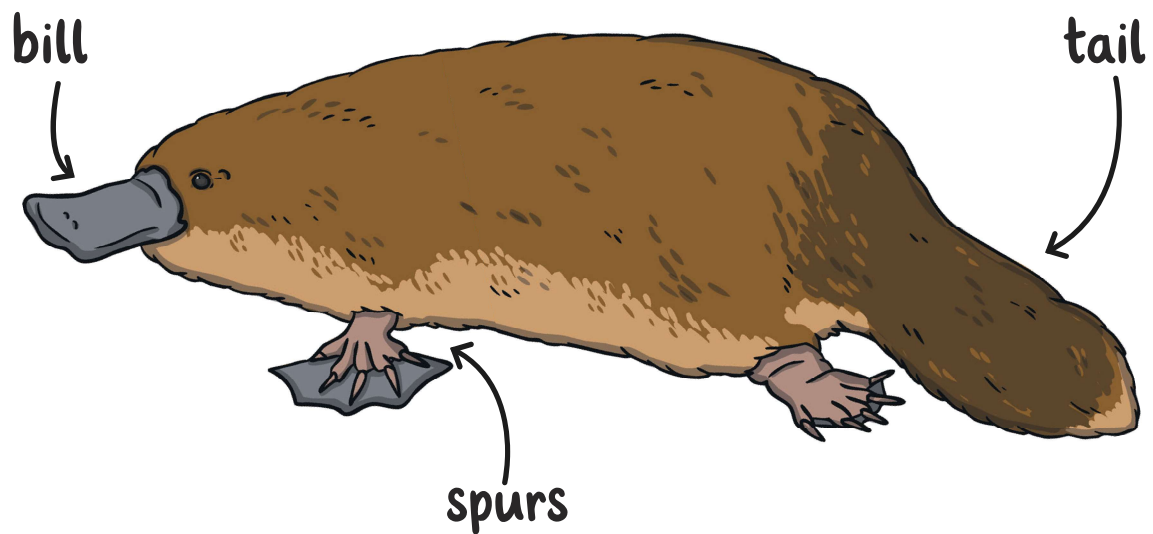
As a carnivore, the platypus is a meat-eater. The platypus uses its swimming and hunting skills to feast on creatures such as yabbies (similar to a lobster), small fish and shrimp. It will also eat worms and insect larvae, which it digs out of the riverbeds using its bill. It collects food in its cheek pouches and takes it back to land to eat. Predators like snakes, owls and goannas (a type of lizard) can be dangerous to the platypus.



Fun Facts

When scientists examined the platypus for the first time in 1799, they thought that it was fake!

The name platypus means flat foot.
