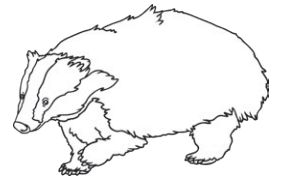

Badger



A badger is a large grey mammal. They can be spotted by their black and white striped face, black stomach and paws and a short, fluffy tail. They are in the same family as stoats, otters and weasels.

There are many badgers found in the UK and they are the biggest land predator with a length of 75-100cm. They can be found in England, Scotland and Wales.

Badgers are nocturnal, which means they are awake at night. They live in large family groups in a burrow known as a 'sett'. You can spot a badger sett by finding a tidy entrance, marked with piles of used bedding. Young badgers (cubs) are born in January or February and spend their first two to three months underground, coming out in spring.

Badgers are omnivores. They eat small animals, bird's eggs, a mixture of fruit and use their sharp front claws to dig for roots in the ground.
