• Charlie meets and greets the children at the beginning of the day

- Children read to Charlie
- He provides a listening ear
- He is responsible for looking after our children especially when they lack self-confidence
- He comforts children who are upset and feel sad
- He has a calming influence

<u>Relaxatíon</u>

- We have a cool kids exercise programme to improve coordination and help children to develop their concentration skills
- We practise yoga and meditation to help children relax and focus
- Children can go to any adult in the school with any problem including the Headteacher
- We have designated staff for leading and supporting wellbeing at school

<u>Facilities</u>

- *Friendship bench*
- Outside quiet area/peace garden
- Lunchtime story and colouring club in the outdoor stage area
- Clubs at lunchtime such as Lego Club, Reading Club, Cross Stitch Club
- 1:1 lunchtime support when needed
- Use of the Sun Room/Nurture Room as a quiet environment when noise levels get too high for vulnerable children, e.g. during DT or lessons involving debate
- Specially arranged sessions to talk about anxieties and worries and exploring strategies to cope
- Playtime monitors

- Sports leaders
- Provision of a Sports Coach five lunchtimes a week to oversee competitive games
